## OPENING KEYNOTE SPEAKER DEBORAH C. POFF, CM, PhD

(She/her/hers)



Deborah Poff is a retired Professor of Philosophy and Senior Academic Administrator. She holds four degrees from three universities in Canada (University of Guelph, Queen's University, Carleton University). Her PhD was in Philosophy of Science. During Deborah's career, she was variously the Director of a Research Institute; a Dean of Arts of Science; a Vice-President Academic and Provost and a President and Vice-Chancellor at various Canadian Universities.

During her career, she served as a member of the COPE council for 10 years including as chair. She has also been an active researcher, teacher and editor of five peer reviewed journals.

She currently edits the Journal of Scholarly Publishing for the University of Toronto Press. Her research areas are: Applied Ethics, including Business and Professional Ethics; Research Ethics, Publication Ethics and Feminist Studies. In 1995, she was awarded a lifetime honorary membership by the Canadian Research Institute for the Advancement of Women in the category of "Outstanding Contribution to Feminist Scholarship". Her recent publications include the Encyclopedia of Business and Professional Ethics (2023) and an anthology on University Corporate Social Responsibility and University Governance (2023). She is currently editing an anthology on Diversity and Discrimination which will be followed by a monograph on the same topic.

In 2016, Deborah Poff was awarded the Order of Canada through the Office of the Governor General of Canada.
