The news

Data collection for the writing task is now complete. The final writing sessions took place at the University of Porto at the end of May. Two research assistants are currently working on blurring the videos to remove any identifiers. The videos will be shared with PUPP researchers once this process is finished. Approximately 60 students and 20 professors participated in the writing tasks.

One Phase 2 project has received funding, entitled *Visuals*. The team leader is **Dimitar Angelov (Coventry University)**, with team members: **Catherine Déri (Université du Québec en Outaouais-UQO)**, **Alyson King (Ontario Tech University)**, and **Martine Peters (UQO)**. The objective of their project is to create four video tutorials on academic integrity and academic literacy, based on the PUPP data.

Cynthia Vincent (Université de Montréal) received two grants for her postdoctoral research with the PUPP (SSHRC and FRQ). Her project, titled *Littératie numérique des étudiant-es universitaires lors de la rédaction académique et prévention du plagiat à l'ère des intelligences artificielles génératives*, aims to identify how students use generative AI to support their academic writing.
